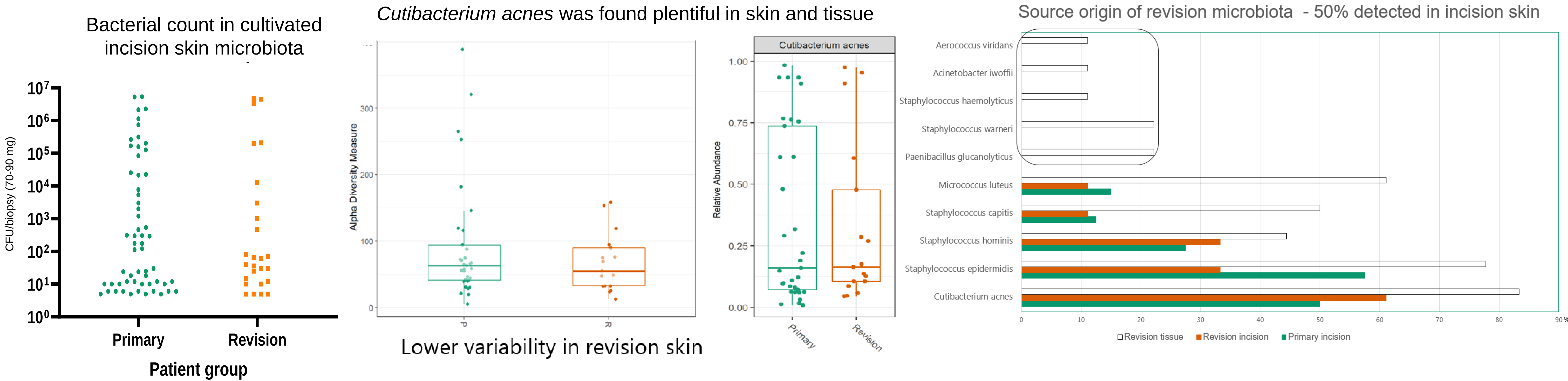
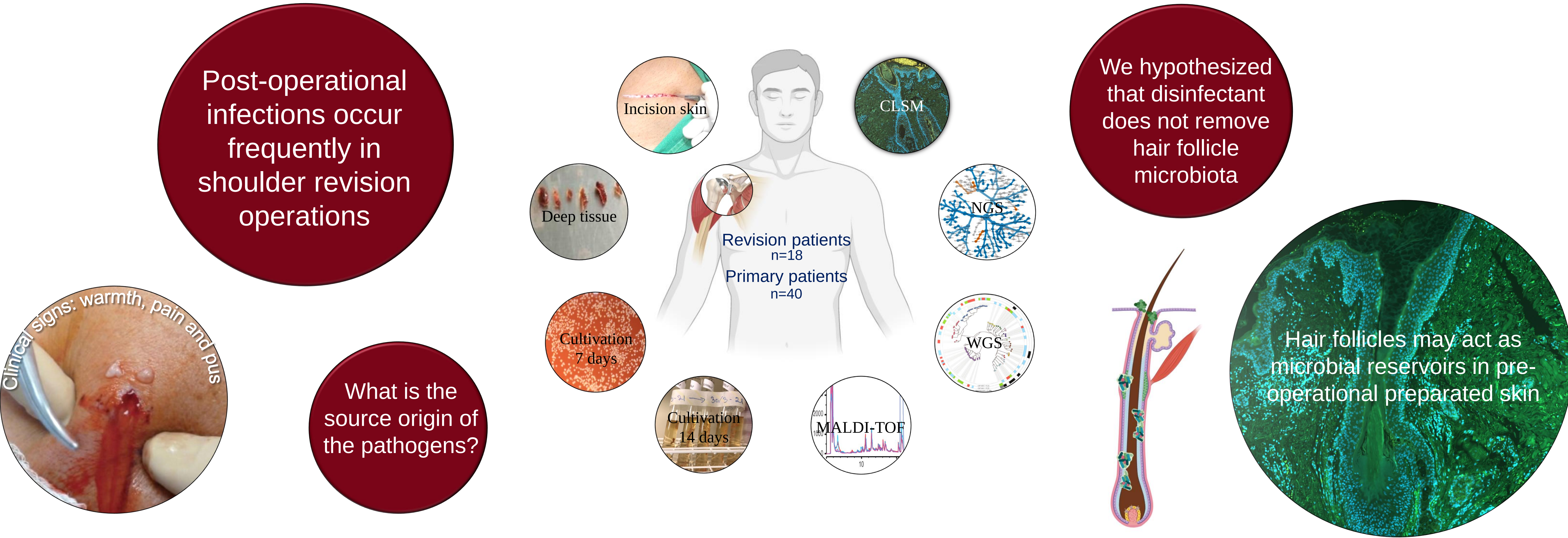




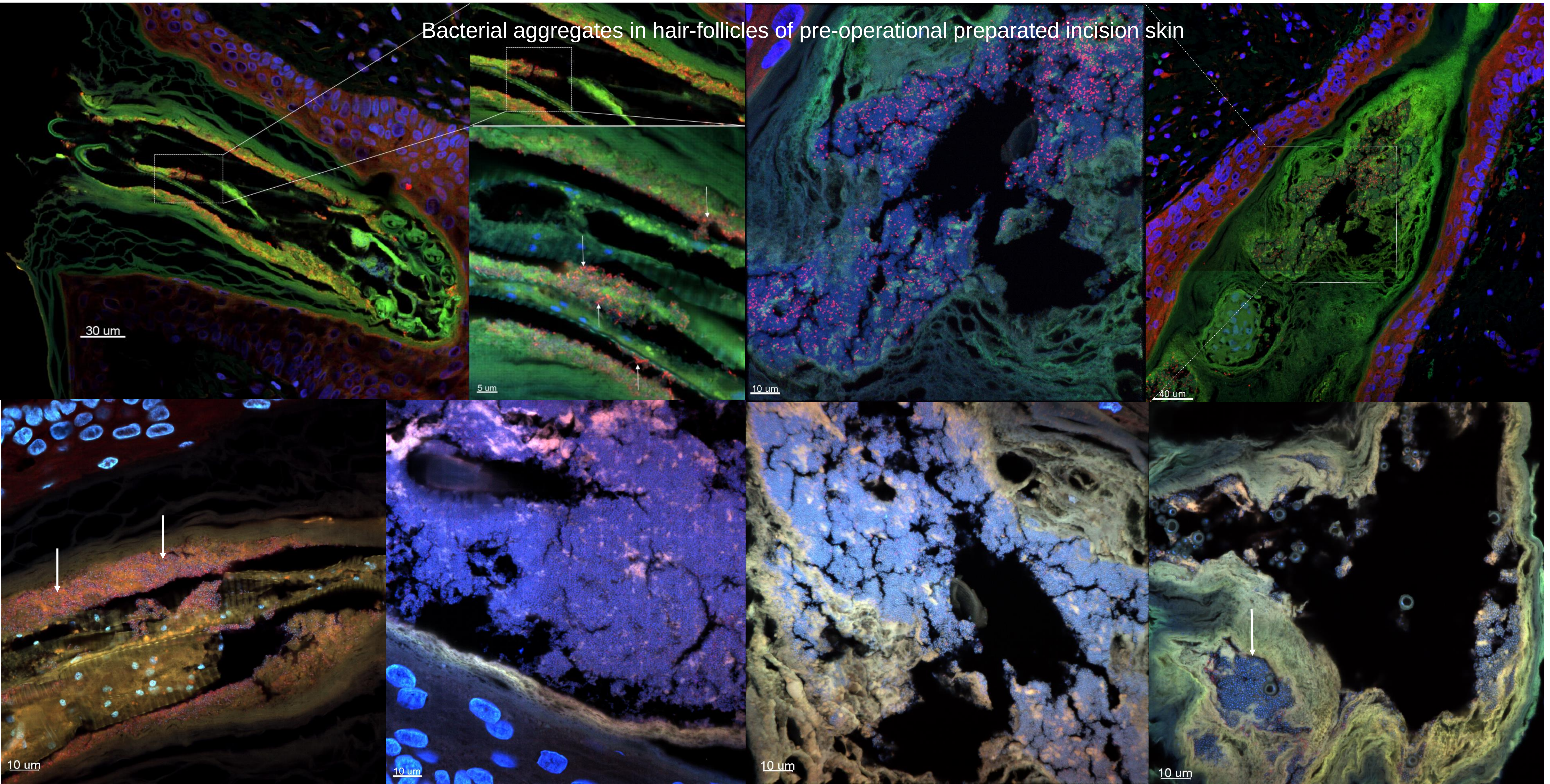
Potential Pathogens in Shoulder Surgery
