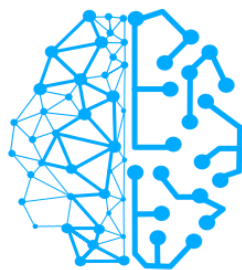


Informational letter for SafeBoosC Investigator meeting 19-20th of May 2022



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Dear principal investigators

As announced previously, the next SafeBoosC investigator meeting will be held as a hybrid meeting in Copenhagen, Denmark from 19-20th of May 2022. This means, that those who cannot attend physically, will be able to join online. Details on how to attend virtually will be sent out later.

The meeting will focus on 1) the results from the SafeBoosC-III trial, 2) the progress of the SafeBoosC-III follow-up study, and 3) the preparations for the SafeBoosC-IIIv trial.

Please be aware that the session on the results from SafeBoosC-III, where two alternative abstracts will be discussed and the results will be unblinded, is confidential. This means that only investigators who will co-author the main publication can attend – this is relevant for those who intend to send a delegate to the meeting.

Please also note that blinded data assessors for the SafeBoosC-III follow-up study are much welcome to participate in sessions regarding the follow-up study. A separate e-mail with relevant information will be sent directly to the blinded assessors later.

As for accommodation and travel, we will cover the local costs, but you will have to provide your own transport. We will only be able to cover local costs for one investigator per hospital, meaning if additional investigators want to participate, they must cover their own local costs (hotel room, food and beverages).

If you wish to participate, please remember to let us know before 1st of April (e-mail to mathias.luehr.hansen@regionh.dk). Also, let us know if you will attend physically or virtually.

Where is the meeting held and will accommodation be provided?

The meeting is held at Comwell Conference Center Copenhagen, Center Boulevard 5, 2100 København S. COVID-19 and travelling to Denmark

As for now, all of you can enter Denmark without having to take a test or self-isolate, as long you are

1. Vaccinated no more than 9 months ago (second dose of a two-dose vaccine) or 9.5 months ago (with a vaccine requiring only one dose), or
2. Revaccinated with a booster dose, or
3. Can document a positive PCR-test more than 11 days ago but less than 180 days ago

How do we get to the venue from the airport?

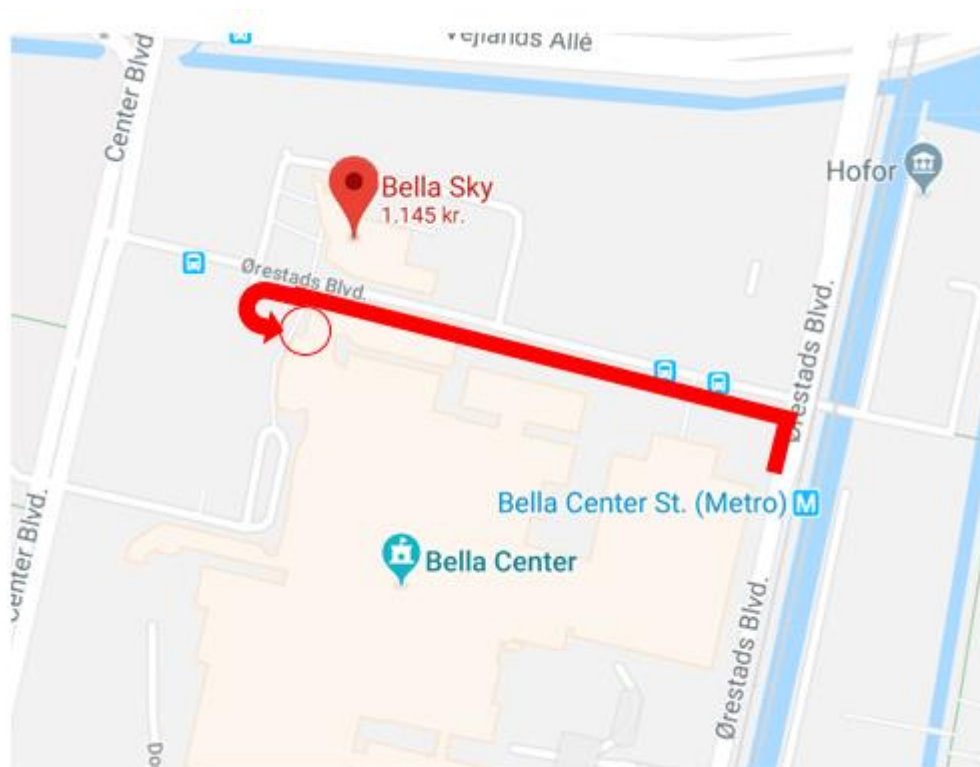
There are multiple ways to transfer from Kastrup airport to the conference center.

Metro – 23 minutes

When arriving in Kastrup airport, go to Terminal 3, where the metro is in direct extension with the airport. It is possible to buy tickets in the ticket machines at the Metro station, using credit card or coins (i.e. you cannot pay with notes) or at “DSB billetsalg” (tickets office) in Terminal 3. Please buy a ticket for 3 zones, it costs 36 danish kroner.

Start by taking the metro towards “Vanløse” (Metro M2), it leaves every 4-6 minutes. On the 7th stop named “Christianshavn”, hop-off the metro and change to the metro towards “Vestamager” (Metro M1). On the 4th stop named “Bella Center” hop-off.

The conference center and hotel are right across the metro station. When exiting the metro station and facing towards the conference center, walk right on Ørestads Boulevard, then left on Ørestads Boulevard for approximately 500 meters. On your left you will find the conference center entrance, use entrance 2 and go to the conference reception (see map).



Regional train and metro – 12 minutes

When arriving in Kastrup airport, go to terminal 3. Tickets can be bought in the ticket machines in terminal 3 (just above the train tracks) or at “DSB billetsalg” (tickets office), also in terminal 3. When you buy a ticket in the ticket machines, find the station named “Bella Center station” through the machines search engine, price is 24 danish kroner. You can only pay with credit card or coins.

Start by taking the train from track 2 (all trains from track 2 goes to Copenhagen), it leaves every 4-12 minutes, and hop-off at “Ørestad station” (second stop). Change here to the metro towards “Vanløse” (Metro M2) and hop-off at Bella Center station (first stop). Use the same walking directions as described when taking the metro solely.

Taxi

Taxis can be found 24 hours outside of both terminal 2 and 3. The price to get from the airport and to the conference center (Comwell Conference Center, Center Boulevard 5, 2100 København S) is approximately 170 DKK (23 Euro).

Will my transportation be paid for?

We will pay for accommodation for all investigators but not transportation.

What to do if I decide to stay longer in Copenhagen?

Copenhagen is a wonderful city with lots of tourist attractions to explore. If you wish to prolong your stay, it is possible to book additional nights through
